Youth Mission Trip

This month, 24 high school youth and 5 adults will embark on their bi-annual mission trip to Puerto Rico. This event has become a reality thanks to the generous gifts of this congregation. Through your donations and attendance at our auction, we were able to raise \$15,600! A record fundraiser! This will benefit our youth on their mission trip tremendously, but more importantly the people they will serve.

The St. Luke youth group has committed the week of June 27 to serve people in need in Arecibo, Puerto Rico. When people think of Puerto Rico, people think of beautiful palm trees, brightly painted buildings, and sunny beaches. During this week of service, however, the youth on this mission trip will come to know the Puerto Rico that many tourists fail to see. With nearly half of the population living below the poverty level, many Puerto Ricans are in need of help. During our time in Arecibo, we will be working with teens in a transitional home, doing work projects, and leading 'Kid's Club' - a ministry program similar to Vacation Bible School.

What the youth bring back to our community may be even more special than the influence they leave behind in Puerto Rico. They will return with a better understanding of Jesus' commandment to "Love thy neighbor". They will experience a culture very different from their own. They will develop a global servanthood as they serve fellow members of the Body of Christ. Indeed, this is a trip that will transform the hearts of every youth.

The congregational support for this youth ministry program is truly inspiring. Thank you again for the support of this mission trip, and we hope you will keep the youth of St. Luke in your prayers as they prepare for this trip.

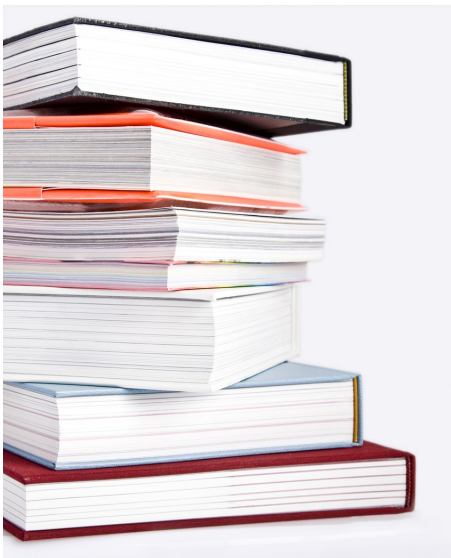
Men's Bible Study

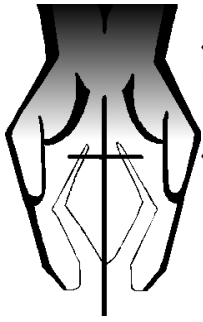
